2023 Grand Marshall Marlin Dietz

Marlin joined the U.S. Air Force five days after his high school graduation in June 1964. He served 21 years at various bases in The States and two tours in Vietnam, 1967-68 as a crew chief on C-123's at Phan Rang Air Base, and 1971-72 at Cam Rahn Bay as a flight engineer on C-7A's flying troops and

cargo into Special Forces Camps.

He earned the Distinguished Flying Cross, six Air Medals, A.F. Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster. Good Conduct Medal with one silver and one bronze oak leaf cluster, National Defense Service Medal. Vietnam Service Medal with one silver star, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with palm, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. He retired from the service as a Master Sargent and his moved his family to Marietta in 1986. He worked at The U.S. Postal Service in Ephrata until his retirement. He served The "William Brenner Post 466" American Legion as Chaplain, and he volunteers for Donegal Power Packs. He has a daughter, Sarah with husband Bryan Reichelt and grandson's in Pine Grove. Also, a son, Preston and his partner Bradley, in Maryland.
